# WHAT SHOULD YOU EXPECT FROM OUR PROVISION?

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

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
A range of stations for the children to visit each day!





<b>8:50am</b>	<b>Doors open at Stanwick Primary for children to enter</b>
<b>8:50am - 9:00am</b>	Self-registration and independent morning activities
<b>9:00am – 10:45am</b>	Learning opportunities (whole class and independent)
<b>10:45am – 11:00am</b>	Play time
<b>11:00am – 12:00pm</b>	Phonics whole class teaching and independent learning.
<b>12:00pm – 1:00pm</b>	Lunch time
<b>1:00pm – 3:00pm</b>	Independent challenges and target teaching.
<b>3:00pm – 3:20pm</b>	Story, language and personal skills time or assembly (Fridays)
<b>3:20pm – 3:25pm</b>	Tidy and home time.

# Sunshine Club

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- The Sunshine Club is a before and after school club that you may wish for your child to be a part of.
- Your child will be fed with either breakfast or an after school snack. Following food, the Sunshine Club provide a range of activities that the children can participate in including drawing, painting, sports games and use of the computers. This club will provide you with the necessary support before and after school, especially if you're in need of that extra time around the school day.
- In the mornings, the club will run from 7:30am and for the afternoon session, the club finishes at 6pm.

# Trips

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- Each year your child will be able to experience a school trip or visitor in the school. This will be linked to their current topics and provide opportunities to deepen their learning across the curriculum.
- Further to the yearly trips, the children will have the chance to attend the residential trips when in year 3 and then again in year 6. This will enable the children to take part in a wide range of learning experiences and develop further skills such as team building and resilience. Children that attend these trips return with a lot of stories to tell and fantastic school memories that will stay with them.
