### Home-School Agreement of Partnership for: .....

#### **PARENTS AND CARERS will endeavour to:**

- Support school in maintaining high expectations of work and behaviour.
- Support all school policies.
- Support the school by encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude towards the school and wider community.
- Attend meetings with my child's teacher and other staff, aiming to be positive and productive, working towards moving my child on in their learning.
- Ensure regular attendance and punctuality, and provide explanations for absence of my/our children.
- Encourage my/our child in his or her homework and other opportunities for home learning.
- Let the school know of any problems which might affect my/our child's work or behaviour.
- Ensure that the school has up to date information for emergency contacts.
- Keep the school informed on child collection arrangements for the end of the school day via the school office.
- Contact the school direct if we have any worries or concerns and not use social media websites to air any grievances. **If parents do not adhere to the points regarding social media websites the school may have to contact Legal Services.**
- Not upload any photographs onto social media sites that were taken at school events, such as Sports Day or School Productions etc, which include any other child.
